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**Antonia Young** trained as a dancer, starting her own ballet school in 1966. During that time, she studied life drawing and pottery, developing an interest in figurative art and portrait heads. Much of Antonia's work features dancers, and captures moments of stillness and movement. Her work has been shown in various galleries in London and she has also had several of her own exhibitions.

Among her portrait heads on public display are: Rudolf Nureyev at The Royal Opera House Wilfred Thesiger at The Royal Geographical Society Charles Mackerras at The Bodleian Library, and Laurie Lee at Stroud Museum in the park.



## **David Welsh**

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**David Welsh** was born in Derbyshire in 1937, and was educated at Eton, and King's College, Cambridge. Now retired, his main career has been as a teacher, but painting has never been far behind. He enjoys portrait painting, as well as landscape work where his specialities are the effect of light, often on water, and interesting and dramatic clouds and skies. In fact he enjoys any new challenge. He has always worked in oils, a medium that he finds very suitable for all the effects he wants to achieve. Recent commissions have included a painting of Richmond Bridge in the snow for use as a charity Christmas card, and a view of the Provost's Lodge and Garden at Eton College, as a gift for the retiring Provost.
